Their dedication and expertise make a real difference, contributing to the smooth delivery of the two day course.



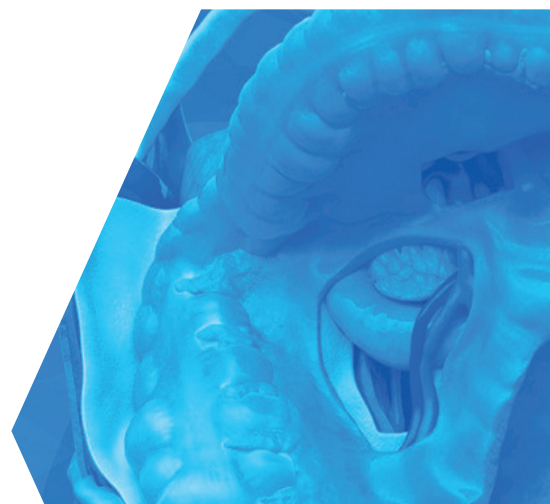
